The next Lunch With... event will be held on **Wednesday March 26th** at 11.30 am in room 1-38 of University Terrace. The speaker will be Daniel Fried, Chair of East Asian Studies at the University of Alberta. The title of his presentation is *The cosmopolitan* **character of ancient Chinese literature:** China has not always

been a united empire or nation-state; during its ancient and early-medieval history it was frequently divided in regional kingdoms that possessed distinct languages and cultures. In this talk, recent advances in our understanding of how early Chinese culture affected other Asian peoples will reveal the cosmopolitan character of Chinese identity between the 5th century BC and 6th century AD.

Lunch will be catered by Upper Crust at a cost of \$20; payment in advance by INTERAC transfer would be appreciated, but payment at the meeting will be accepted. Paid parking will be available in College Plaza and is accessible from 112 Street by turning onto 83 Avenue and driving east until turning right into the parkade. Room 1-38 is at the far east on the first floor of University Terrace.
