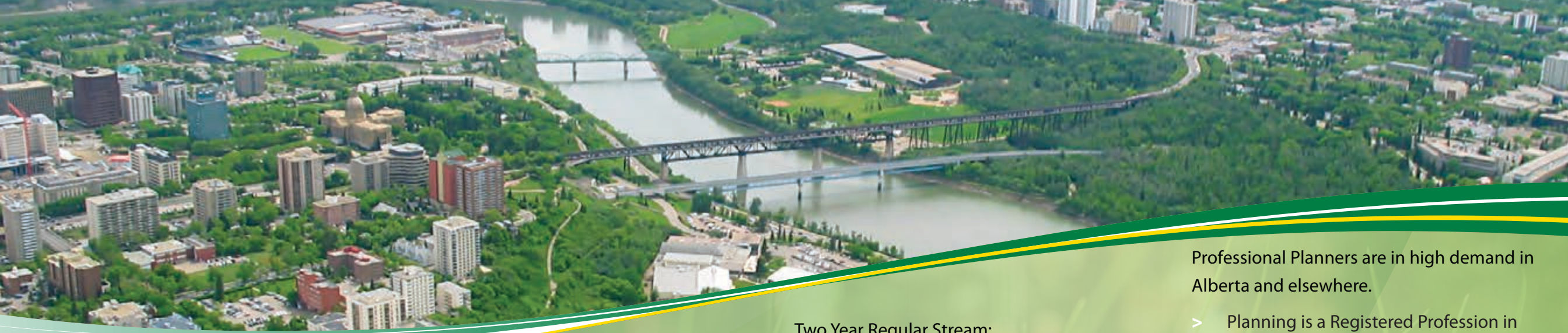




Master's in Urban and Regional PLANNING

New Master's degree in Urban and Regional Planning emphasises the development of a critical understanding of environmental and the economic processes in planning for growing regions and large and small towns.

In 2017, the University of Alberta will be launching a new course-based graduate degree program in planning.

- > An emphasis on land use planning and policy development to enhance community resilience to economic, social, and environmental challenges
- > Program designed in line with professional accreditation standards
- > 2 year and 1 year streams



GRADUATE PROGRAM

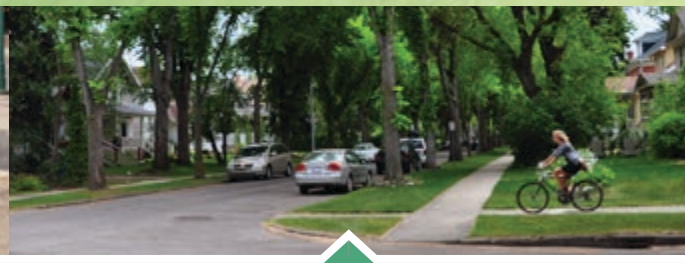
Two Year Regular Stream:

- > Four year undergraduate degree from a recognized University
- > Minimum B average on last 60 credits

One Year Accelerated Stream:

- > Undergraduate degree in planning and two or more calendar years professional experience in Planning, or
- > Case by case assessment of other combinations of experience and degrees
